**ANSWER 07**

a) PG&E interprets this question to relate to OSHA-recordable injuries associated with asset inspection work, rather than OSHA-reportable injuries. Note that PG&E did not collect detailed contractor incident data at the individual program level (i.e., for asset inspections specifically) prior to mid-2019.
