

Neil Flaiz Storm Update 11.22.2024

PG&E Meteorologist, Neil Flaiz here to provide you an update on the current conditions that we are seeing. So currently, we do have a cold front that is draped across our territory, extending from the Bay Area up into the Lake Tahoe area. That front is now becoming more progressive as it slides through the remainder of our territory. We did see the front move into our North Coast area earlier this morning. We did see wind gusts of 40 to 60 miles an hour, along with periods of moderate to locally heavy rainfall. As the front slides southward into the Bay Area today, we are currently seeing winds right now, anywhere from 25 to 35 miles an hour. There is potential that we could see winds increase to about 40 or 50 miles an hour as we get through the morning into the early afternoon. This will coincide with periods, again, of moderate to heavy rainfall. And then that front will slowly begin to slide southward later this evening and overnight into our southern half of our territory, both along the Central Coast, and in the San Joaquin Valley. Right now, it's looking like wind gusts would be generally in the 25 to 35 mile an hour range, as it moves into the Central Coast and into the far South. We will see the precipitation continue. For tomorrow, we will see the scattered showers and chance of thunderstorms continue. Rainfall, though, will be a lot less in terms of overall accumulations. But still, we do expect 1 to 4 inches of additional precipitation across lower elevations through tomorrow, with higher elevations seen anywhere from 2 to 6 plus inches. And then beyond that, it does look like additional waves of precipitation will be possible Sunday through Tuesday. Although, the storm doesn't look to be nearly as strong as what we've been seeing the past couple of days.
