



When planning a development project, it is important that any new buildings or landscaping are located a safe distance from overhead and underground utility lines. Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has developed the following 3-step guide to assist cities/counties, builders, and developers with ensuring preliminary plans are compatible with any PG&E electric or gas facilities in the area.

STEP 1 SUBMIT

Please send all preliminary planning documents to pgeplanreview@pge.com. Planning documents include (but may not be limited to): Engineer drawings, subdivision/tract maps, surveys.

This plan review process does not replace the application process for PG&E gas or electric service. For these requests, please submit requests on PG&E's [Your Projects](#).

STEP 2 REVIEW

PG&E will review the planning documents to confirm:

- Plans accurately depict the location(s) of PG&E's facilities. Contact DelineationMapRequests@pge.com to obtain maps delineating PG&E's existing gas facilities. Sign up for PG&E's [Joint Use Map Portal \(Jump\)](#) to obtain maps delineating PG&E's existing electric facilities.
- Plans are compatible with any existing or proposed gas or electric facilities.
- Compliance with existing easements, if applicable.

STEP 3 RESPONSE

Within 45-days* of submission, PG&E will issue a response letter.

- If no impacts are identified, PG&E will provide a no impact letter, along with any requirements that must be followed when working near PG&E's facilities. If impacts are identified, PG&E will provide comments to the submitter to update and re-submit the plans.

*High volume of requests may extend the expected response to the submitted plans.
