Introduction

The function of the Utility Industry Group is

To represent Electric, Gas, and Combination Utilities, their suppliers, their customers, and other interested parties as an Industry Action Group to the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Accredited Standards Committee (ASC) X12, specifically in the standards-setting process, for their Electronic Data Interchange business needs.

To encourage, promote, and establish conventions for the use of ASC X12 standards as the "recommended" method of EDI. To develop and coordinate, as required, implementation guidelines and tools to promote the growth and timely implementation of Electronic Commerce/EDI within the industry.

To provide a forum for the exchange of ideas related to Electronic Commerce/EDI and its influence on the business needs of the industry.

The UIG will represent the Edison Electric Institute (EEI) and its members to facilitate implementation of Electronic Commerce/EDI in the Utility Industry.

Purpose

This Utility Industry Group (UIG) Implementation Guideline contains the format and establishes the data contents of the Application Advice Transaction Set (TS 824) as adopted by the UIG for use within the context of an Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) environment. This standard can be used to respond to transactions which do not have built-in response mechanisms (such as TS 814), or those without specified response transactions (such as a purchase order acknowledgement sent in response to a purchase order). The Application Advice should <u>not</u> be used in place of a transaction set designed as a specific response to the same or another transaction set (e.g., a TS 814 Enrollment Confirmation transaction or TS 814 Error transaction are designed as responses to an TS 814 Request for Enrollment in the deregulated, alternative energy supply environment).



Notes

The UIG recommends the use of the Deregulation Application Advice (TS 824) transaction set to acknowledge the acceptance or rejection of 248, 568, 650, 810, 820 and 867 transactions. TS 824 would <u>not</u> be used for responses to TS 814, since TS 814 is designed to also be used as a response to requests received via TS 814.

Typical uses in this environment would be use of TS 824 Application Advice to acknowledge acceptance of a TS 810 Invoice or to send an application error response to a usage transaction received via TS 867.

While it is possible to send acceptance/rejection messages as plain text, this guideline has been designed to be used with messages that are coded to be machine-processable in subsequent applications.



824 Application Advice Best Practices

Global Best Practices

Use of Text Segments

The UIG recommends that the note (NTE) segment be avoided because this segment is not machine-readable. Other text segments, such as MSG and PID, may be used if their use will lead to machine processable information in subsequent applications.

Use of ZZ Qualifier

The use of data fields to transmit uncoded or textual information should be avoided. This practice is usually associated with the use of the ZZ qualifier as a normal course of doing business.

997 – Functional Acknowledgment

The purpose of the 997 is to verify receipt of a transmitted document only, not the acceptance of the document. For example, the acceptance of a purchase order (850) is accomplished through the use of the purchase order acknowledgment transaction (855).

Interchange Control Number

A unique and sequential interchange control number should be used on every envelope that is transmitted to a trading partner. This approach will allow the receiver to audit the interchange for any duplicate or missing transmissions.

Use of Dun & Bradstreet (D-U-N-S) Number

Dun & Bradstreet assigns a nine-digit identification number to every business entity. This number, known as the D-U-N-S number, should be used to identify the trading partners. A trading partner may append a four-digit suffix to the D-U-N-S number to uniquely identify a specific location within the entity; this number is referred to as a D-U-N-S + 4 number

Banking Transactions

Guidelines that outline the use of transactions relating to interactions between a sender and the sender's financial institution are available from the Bankers EDI Council and the NACHA EDI Council. Other publications that address the use of financial payment transactions include Technical Report 1 (TR1) and Technical Report 2 (TR2); both of these publications are available from DISA.

Capitalization

The use of all upper case (capital) letters is preferred over the use of mixed upper and lower case letters.

Time Value

PG&E transmits all information using the international standard, Universal

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Coordinate Time (UTC). UTC, for the purposes of this document, is simply the Pacific Standard Time (PST) without daylight savings time correction. UTC is an internationally recognized time representation and is actually used in nearly all of our modern computer systems, including desktop PCs. Meter readings, administrative operations, and billing transactions are all reported in UTC. Some account billing is based upon time-of-day which is normally defined in terms of local time. For those accounts, conversion from UTC to local time must be performed. Differences from UTC to PST is 8 hours, i.e. (480 minutes). PG&E's service territory local time is based on Pacific Standard Time (PST). The California PG&E's have decided not to indicate a specific code in the 814 Transaction set. Use of DTM02/03 Use of DTM02/03 rather than DTM05/06 allows the translator to validate on the date and time. This facilitates immediate rejection with the 997. While there is at present no preferred coding practice, UIG encourages the use of the DTM02/03 in new implementations, where possible.

Document-Specific Best Practices

The UIG recommends that one TS 824 Application Advice be limited to one service account for a single commodity (electric or gas). This single service account may have more than one service or meter associated with it, in which case a separate OTI loop should be used for each service or meter. An exception would be if the 824 is used to reject an entire 820 or 568, in which case individual service accounts are not provided.

Introduction:

This Draft Standard for Trial Use contains the format and establishes the data contents of the Application Advice Transaction Set (824) for use within the context of an Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) environment. The transaction set can be used to provide the ability to report the results of an application system's data content edits of transaction sets. The results of editing transaction sets can be reported at the functional group and transaction set level, in either coded or free-form format. It is designed to accommodate the business need of reporting the acceptance, rejection or acceptance with change of any transaction set. The Application Advice should not be used in place of a transaction set designed as a specific response to another transaction set (e.g., purchase order acknowledgment sent in response to a purchase order).

- 2. The REF segment allows for the provision of secondary reference identification or numbers required to uniquely identify the original transaction set. The primary reference identification or number should be provided in elements OTI02-03.
- **3.** The DTM segment allows for the provision of date, time, or date and time information required to uniquely identify the original transaction set.
