Subject: Second Supplemental: Request for Continuation of the Mobile Home Park Utility Upgrade Program in Compliance with D.14-03-021

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) previously submitted for filing changes to Gas and Electric Rule 28. PG&E hereby submits this supplement to modify its filing.

Purpose

The purpose of this supplemental filing is to delete the requested changes to the tariff sheets originally contained within Advice 3822-G/5033-E, filed on March 17, 2017 and in Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A, filed on March 28, 2017. PG&E also requests to remove the section with heading title "Program Continuation" contained within Advice 3822-G/5033-E, filed on March 17, 2017. These changes are made in accordance with General Order (GO) 96-B, General Rules 7.5.1, which authorizes utilities to make changes or provide additional information to a previous filing via the filing of a supplemental advice letter.

This advice letter supplements Advice 3822-G/5033-E and Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A in part, and does not change the original integrity of those filings except as described herein.

Background

On March 17, 2017, PG&E filed Advice 3822-G/5033-E (Advice Letter) to request the continuation of the Mobile Home Park Utility Upgrade Program (MHP Program or Program) through 2018 to enable the utility to complete previously authorized conversions. Additionally, PG&E's Advice Letter sought authority to extend the voluntary MHP Program to include 8,335 MHP spaces previously identified by the Commission's Safety and Enforcement Division. On March 28, 2017, PG&E filed Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A to provide additional information.

On April 21, 2017, TURN protested PG&E's Advice 3822-G/5033-E and Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A. TURN recommended the Commission reject PG&E's advice letters and direct PG&E to refile the advice letters with additional information. PG&E responded to TURN's April 21, 2017 late-filed protest on April 28, 2017.

On June 21, 2017, TURN submitted an amended protest. TURN recommends the Commission reject PG&E's Advice Letter because TURN alleges the relief sought through the advice letter should be requested through a formal application. PG&E responded to TURN's June 21, 2017 amended protest on June 28, 2017.

Request

In response to TURN's concerns, PG&E requests to remove its request from Advice 3822-G/5033-E and Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A to continue the MHP Program beyond 2018. PG&E's pending request in Advice 3822-G/5033-E to complete the MHP Program through December 31, 2018 to allow for conversion of all remaining MHP conversion work initiated during the 3-year pilot is unchanged by this supplement. Accordingly, PG&E requests to delete the requested changes to the tariff sheets originally contained within Advice 3822-G/5033-E, filed on March 17, 2017 and in Advice 3822-G-A/5033-E-A, filed on March 28, 2017. PG&E also requests to remove the section with heading title "Program Continuation" contained within Advice 3822-G/5033-E, filed on March 17, 2017.

PG&E has conferred with TURN. TURN authorizes PG&E to state that TURN supports completion of the pilot into 2018 as PG&E proposed, and that TURN supports the removal of the 'Program Continuation' request contained in Advice 3822-G/5033-E and corresponding tariff changes.

Protests

Pursuant to CPUC General Order 96-B, Section 7.5.1, and Energy Division direction, PG&E hereby requests the protest period be waived, due to the limited nature of this supplement.

Effective Date

PG&E requests that this Tier 2 advice filing become effective concurrent with Advice 3822-G/5033-E, which is April 16, 2017.
