

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California (CPUC)

<u>Subject:</u> Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, Wellhead – Generation Substation Interconnection

Project, County of Fresno

An electric utility regulated by the California Public Utilities Commission intends to construct new facilities near Mendota, California in the outlying area of Fresno County. These facilities are being constructed to help alleviate the energy emergency currently facing California. Because of this energy emergency, the California Public Utilities Commission is considering such projects on an expedited basis. (California Public Utilities Commission Resolution E-3732.)

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4 the Notice of Proposed Construction and Reconstruction of a power line in the County of Fresno. The notice described in G.O. 131-D Section XI, Paragraph C, is submitted as Attachment I.¹

<u>Purpose</u>

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction and Reconstruction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI, Subsections B and C.

<u>Background</u>

Wellhead has requested the Company to interconnect their proposed 49 megawatt generation plant near Panoche Substation on Panoche Road. The proposed

generation plant is located adjacent to PG&E's Panoche Substation and near the Cheney #1 Tap 115 kilovolt power line. The interconnection would require relocating and intersetting a pole in the existing Company's Cheney #1 Tap 115 kilovolt (kV) power line near pole 0/4, and connecting to the proposed Wellhead generation plant. The existing pole 0/4 will be relocated/replaced approximately 75 feet in line to the south and the interconnect to the proposed facility will be approximately 175 feet to the west. The relocation and interconnection is scheduled to begin in September 2001, or as soon as possible thereafter and to be in service in September 2001 or as soon as construction is completed. Wellhead obtained approval from Fresno County to construct the project.

Pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Paragraph B, Subsections 1(c),1(f), and 1(g), the relocation of this power line is exempt from a Permit to Construct. Subsection 1(c) states that a Permit to Construct is not required for the minor relocation of existing power line facilities, or the intersetting of additional supporting structures between existing supporting structures, up to 2,000 feet in length; 1(f) states power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation; and 1(g) states power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, roadwidening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Additionally, G.O. 131-D requires utilities to employ "no cost" and "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields (EMFs). There are no low cost or no cost alternatives available for this project.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Any protest letter must be received by the California Public Utilities Commission and Pacific Gas and Electric Company by September 24. 2001.

If the California Public Utilities Commission determines that the proposed project is a proper exemption and no protests are received by **September 24, 2001**, Pacific Gas and Electric Company may commence construction by **October 4, 2001**, or with the issuance of a California Public Utilities Commission Executive Director Resolution, whichever is earlier. If protest letters are properly filed with the California Public Utilities Commission and Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Pacific Gas and Electric Company may not start construction until a California Public Utilities Commission Executive Director Resolution is issued.

Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction and reconstruction if they believe that the Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in G.O. 131-D, Section III.B.2, exist. The protest shall set forth the grounds upon which it is based and shall be submitted expeditiously.

Effective Date

The Company requests that this advice filing become effective on **September 24**, **2001**, which is 20 days after the date of filing.

In accordance with G.O. 96-A, Section III, Paragraph G, the Company is electronically and postal mailing copies of this advice letter to the utilities and interested parties shown on the attached list, including the parties listed in G.O. 131-D, Section XI, Paragraphs B.1 and B.2.
