Sacramento

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

## **Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D. Section XI.

## **Background**

In order to maintain service reliability and meet increasing electric load demands in Woodland, West Sacramento and Davis, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is proposing to reconductor (replace the existing wires with new wires) the existing West Sacramento-Brighton 115kV and Rio Oso-West Sacramento 115kV power lines, which are co-located on the same towers and poles between Brighton Substation in the City of Sacramento, and West Sacramento Substation in the City of West Sacramento, a distance of approximately 13 miles. The project will consist of replacing the existing wires with new wires (placing of new conductors) on the existing structures in the same alignment (existing public utility easement), beginning at Brighton Substation at the southeast corner of Folsom Boulevard and Power Inn Road in Sacramento, extending north along Howe Avenue to Fair Oaks Boulevard and then west to the American River Parkway, continuing west to Discovery Park, north to West El Camino Avenue, west to Interstate 80, south paralleling Interstate 80 to Stillwater Road and Riverside Parkway, and east to the West Sacramento Substation on Oak Street south of Reed Avenue in West Sacramento. To maintain minimum clearance requirements under the Commission's General Order 95, five steel towers will require cage extensions, raising the conductors approximately 10' above their current height on four towers and approximately 15' at one tower. In addition, two 61' wood poles will be replaced with one 70' tubular steel pole west of Harbor Boulevard and south of Reed Avenue. Construction is scheduled to begin in August 2008 or as soon thereafter as possible, with completion in May 2009 or as soon as possible after construction begins.

• This project qualifies as exempt from Permit to Construct filing requirements, pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1., which exempts, "The placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built," and "Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts."

Additionally, G.O. 131-D requires utilities to employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields (EMFs) in accordance with CPUC Decision 06-01-042 and the "EMF Guidelines for Electrical Facilities." The following measures are proposed for this project:

 Optimize phase configuration by "cross-phasing" individual circuits to cancel magnetic fields.

**Electric and Magnetic Fields (EMF):** Pacific Gas and Electric Company will employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to EMF in accordance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision 06-01-042 and Pacific Gas and Electric Company's "EMF Design Guidelines for Electrical Facilities." The following measures are proposed for this project:

Optimize phase configuration by "cross-phasing" individual circuits to cancel magnetic fields.

**Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement:** CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption:

- The placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built.
- Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility
  easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local
  agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

**Public Review Process:** Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

#### Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
